• GOSSIP

• Defined:

Idle talk or rumor, especially about the personal or private affairs of others a vain, thoughtless, useless word; a word that accomplishes no good (Matt. 12:36)

```
(Prov. 11:13) - "talebearer" NIV - "gossip" (Prov. 16:28) - "whisperer"
```



- GOSSIP
 - Practical Definition/Scriptural Examples:
 - (Prov. 11:13) Betraying a confidence.
 - (1st Tim. 5:13) Saying things they ought not.



• SLANDER

• Defined:

The utterance of false charges or misrepresentations which defame and damage another's reputation

A false spoken statement that causes people to have a bad opinion of someone



- SLANDER
 - Practical Definition/Scriptural Examples:
 - (Gen. 3:4, 5) Planting seeds of doubt; insinuations.
 - Planting seeds of negativity amongst positive comments.
