IIIII Establishing Authority (Communication)

- Basic Methods in All Communication
 - Tell (Statement or Command)
 - "Son, clean your room."
 - Show (Example)
 - Show what to do and/or how to clean the room.
 - Imply (Necessary Inference)
 - "I want to see your room is clean when I get home."
